▶ ▶ ▶ HOW DOES IDIPIC REACH OUR YOUTH? Let us count the ways! ◀ ◀ ◀

HIGH SCHOOLS: *Prevention classes / Th!nk, Don't Drink II* -- Driver's ed. students at the end of a safe driving presentation by IDIPIC try to "walk-the-line" while visually "under the influence." In this case, they are "safely" impaired, wearing the Fatal Vision™ goggles and doing a simulation of a police Field Sobriety Test. Reaches over 400 driver's ed. students throughout Whidbey each year.

Pre-Prom / Choose To Be Buzz Free -- Display Table with safety message freebies and handouts and Fatal Vision™ tryouts by students during event.

Panel: All Whidbey driver's ed. students are required by their Traffic Safety School or Instructor to attend an IDIPIC panel and to bring one of their parents.

MIDDLE SCHOOLS: *Th!nk, Don't Drink* -- Display Table & Fatal Vision™ event during lunch periods each spring and fall (Red Ribbon Week).

ELEMENTARY SCHOOLS: *PICKLES: Positive Influences Changing Kids' Lives in Elementary Schools* -- interactive classroom presentations and good bags.

MILITARY COMMANDS: *Bi-monthly Panels / Safety Fairs* at NAS Whidbey Island. (Most commands have under-21 personnel.).

COMMUNITY YOUTH, SAFETY & HEALTH EVENTS and CLASSES: *Display Booth & Fatal Vision™ walk-the-line or obstacle course* at National Night Out, Children's Day, NAS Whidbey's Fleet & Family Support Center's Readiness Fair, Be Safe Be Seen on Halloween, other events.

Prevention classes: to low-risk juvenile offenders and families as part of Juvenile Services "Community Connections" program.

Panel: free-of-charge to youth referred by Juvenile Court Services or Youth Court.
