HIGH SCHOOLS: *Prevention classes / Th!nk, Don't Drink II* Interactive classroom presentations with driver's ed. students that include video, Q & A, and a chance to "walk-the-line" while visually "under the influence." In this case, they are "safely" impaired, wearing the Fatal Vision™ goggles and doing a simulation of a police Field Sobriety Test. Reaches over 400 driver's ed. students throughout Whidbey each year.

Pre-Prom / Choose To Be Buzz Free -- Display Table with safety message freebies and handouts and Fatal Vision™ tryouts by students during event.

Panel: All Whidbey driver's ed. students are required by their Traffic Safety School or Instructor to attend an IDIPIC panel and to bring one of their parents. (IDIPIC is the only DUI impact panel (of about 30) in our state where **both** are required to attend for course completion.)

MIDDLE SCHOOLS: *Th!nk, Don't Drink* Fatal Vision™ event during lunchtime each fall (Red Ribbon Week) and spring (Alcohol Awareness Month).

ELEMENTARY SCHOOLS: *PICKLES: Positive Influences Changing Kids' Lives in Elementary Schools/3rd Gr* Interactive classroom presentations by request.

MILITARY COMMANDS: *8 Panels Per Year by Command Request / Safety Fairs* at NAS Whidbey Island. (Most commands have under-21 personnel.)

COMMUNITY YOUTH, SAFETY & HEALTH EVENTS and CLASSES: *Display Booth & Fatal Vision™ walk-the-line or obstacle course* at National Night Out, Children's Day, Be Safe Be Seen on Halloween, etc. Other school and community health or safety event participation always welcome. Just request!
